A clutch of the UK's most exciting architects have been selected to work on a new 220-home scheme in the Czech Republic. The Arendon Development Company has selected Coffey Architects, Duzzan Morris Architects, Eldridge Smerin, Hall McKnight, Haptic, John Pardey Architects and McGarry-Moon Architects to work on projects on the outskirts of Prague, together worth £400 million (£314 million). The seven British firms were chosen alongside Czech practices
